
FABRIC, YARN & NOTIONS SALE







REAL PROPERTY TAX CREDIT FOR HOMEOWNERS. The City &

County of Honolulu offers a real property tax credit to property owners who meet certain eligibility requirements. If you qualify, the maximum real property tax owed would not exceed 3% of income (75 and older) or 4% (under age 75). Eligibility Requirements: Homeowners must have a home exemption in effect at the time of application and for the subsequent tax year; Any of the titleholders do not own any other property anywhere; and the combined income of all titleholders cannot exceed \$50,000. To apply, complete an application which is available at

the following locations: Satellite City Halls, Treasury Division at Honolulu Hale, Tax Relief Section at the Standard Financial Bldg, or on line @http:www.honolulu.gov/budget/Treasury_division.htm. Deadline to submit application is September 30. You must file annually for this credit. For more information contact the Real Property Tax Relief Office at 768-3205.
