VIDEO: "THE UNTOLD STORY: INTERNMENT OF JAPANESE AMERICANS IN HAWAII"

(57-mins., DVD)

Within hours of Japan's attack on Pearl Harbor, Hawaii authorities arrested several hundred local Japanese on Oahu, Hawaii and Kauai. They were Buddhist priests, Japanese language school officials, newspaper editors, business and community leaders. In total, over 2,000 men and women of Japanese ancestry were arrested, detained and incarcerated in 13 confinement sites throughout Hawaii with no evidence of espionage or sabotage and no charges were ever filed against them. This is the first full-length documentary to chronicle this untold story in Hawaii history.

REAL PROPERTY TAX CREDIT FOR HOMEOWNERS through The City & County of Honolulu who meet certain eligibility requirements. If you qualify, the maximum real property tax owed would not exceed 3% or 4% of your income, depending on your age. Eligibility Requirements: Homeowners must have a home exemption in effect at the time of application and for the subsequent tax year; Any of the titleholders do not own any other property anywhere; and the combined income of all titleholders cannot exceed \$50,000.
