ELEVATOR SAFETY ... If you are Stalled in an Elevator

- 1. Push the "Door Open" Button If you are near the landing the door will open. Be sure to watch your step as the elevator floor may or may not, be level with the landing.
- 2. Remain Calm If the door does not open, you are still safe. Do not try to exit the elevator. Wait for trained emergency personnel to arrive. Even if the air temperature feels warm, there is plenty of air circulating in the elevator and its hoistway.
- 3. Press the Alarm or Call (Help) Button, and Use Any Available Communication System Push the alarm button and wait for someone to respond to you. Push the Call (Phone) button. When pushed, this will place a call to a party that is trained to take action. It will give the exact location of the building and elevator you are in.
- 4. Relax, and DO NOT Try to Extract Yourself from the Elevator NEVER try to exit a stalled elevator car. It is extremely dangerous. ALWAYS wait for trained emergency personnel. Your best course of action is to relax, get comfortable, and wait for professional assistance. You may be inconvenienced but you are SAFE.
